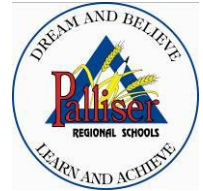

Though our students may be more familiar with the reality show that shares the same name as "Big Brother", it was our hope as directors that the cast and audience would learn from Winston and truly embrace the message of freedom of choice.

Band

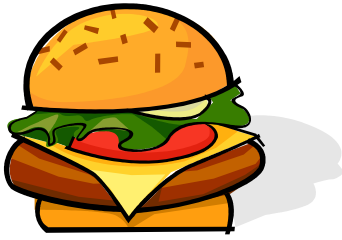

Rebecca Tokariuk received the ATB Financial 4-H Scholarship. 4-H members who exhibit outstanding 4-H achievement, community involvement and academic achievement are the requirements for this award.

Smack Risk / No Regrets - Counselor's Corner

THE STUPID LINE

The Stupid Line is the line of choice that separates a smart risk from a stupid risk. In understanding how individuals perceive and take risks, SMARTRISK believes that for each of us there is a continuum of risk. At the one end of the spectrum are risks that none of us are prepared to take because we feel the risk is too

high. At the other end of the spectrum are risks that we take so much for granted that we don't perceive the risk at all. Where the Stupid Line is drawn is different for each person, and can change depending on the situation a person is in. The Stupid Line allows an individual to exercise their ability to choose smart risks.

The staff and student body of Kate Andrews High would like to send Christmas wishes to all for a safe and happy holiday. The student council members will use the 5 messages from the Smart Risk /No Regrets program to create awareness with our Kate Andrews students and staff. These messages include:

1. **BUCKLE UP.** Always make sure that your and the other passengers and driver are wearing seatbelts.
2. **LOOK FIRST.** Don't get into a car with a driver who has been drinking and don't drive if you have been drinking. Keep cab fare money to get home safe.
3. **WEAR THE GEAR.** The only gear that will protect you from a drunk driver is your brain. Don't get into a car with an impaired driver.
4. **GET TRAINED.** Learn to say no to people who want you to drive with them when they have been drinking, and learn to say no to people who want you to drive them home after you've been drinking.
5. **DRIVE SOBER.** Always have a designated driver. Have a pre-arranged backup plan for getting home rather than traveling with an impaired driver.
