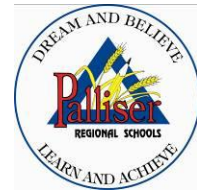

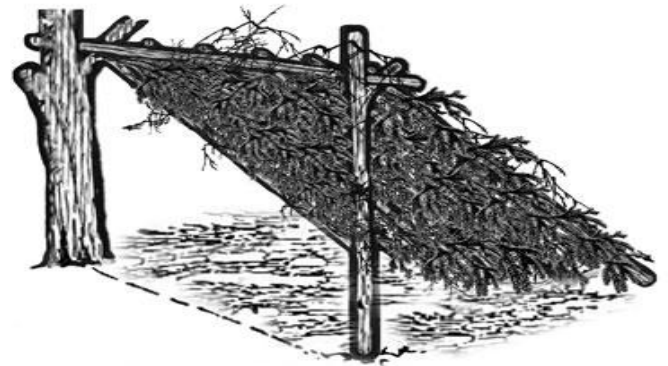
New Award

On May 4th we received \$600.00 from the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Alberta from the Lethbridge ICAA Centennial Ambassadors. This local group of volunteers was formed to promote and encourage early interaction and support of the chartered accountants profession by attracting future CAs to the endless possibilities offered by the chartered accountant designation. \$7,800 was raised to enable 13 scholarship awards, in the amount of \$60.00 each, to be awarded in each of the next 10 years for students in 8 local high schools. Marine Biology Trip 2011 - by Mr. Schilling

Fourteen students and two teachers ventured to the Gulf Islands for a five day marine biology trip on March 30 (returning April 4). The trip was fantastic! We began our adventure at the Shaw Ocean Discovery Centre in Sidney, BC. This facility provided hands on opportunities for the students on the trip to see and touch many of the things that we would see on the marine biology trip. After a brief adventure through the town of Sidney, we boarded the *Island Odyssey*, our floating home for the next five days. Our crew, led by Captain Tom, assisted by naturalist Caitlin, and first mate, Rachel, were extraordinary! Their collective wealth of knowledge of the Gulf Islands made the trip very enjoyable. The trip was filled with many highlights including

three unheard of days of Orca sightings. We were fortunate to see transient and resident whales, including baby Orcas that looked like they were dipped in ketchup. Other highlights included exploring the tidal pools off Montague Bay and hiking up Mount Norman to see the beautiful vistas and to experience first-hand the slopes of the coastal rain forest. The students on the trip also participated fully on the running of the Island Odyssey, they were responsible for the cooking of meals, cleaning of the decks, navigating the charts, steering the yacht, and learning about the surrounding area. In the evenings, students gave presentations on things they had learned about and on the final night an evening of skits filled the boat with bouts of laughter. The final night was led to the tradition of jumping off the front of the boat into the frigid waters of the Pacific, only a handful of brave souls managed, and it was totally worth the ten seconds we spent in the water!

The trip can easily be summed up in one word: AWESOME!

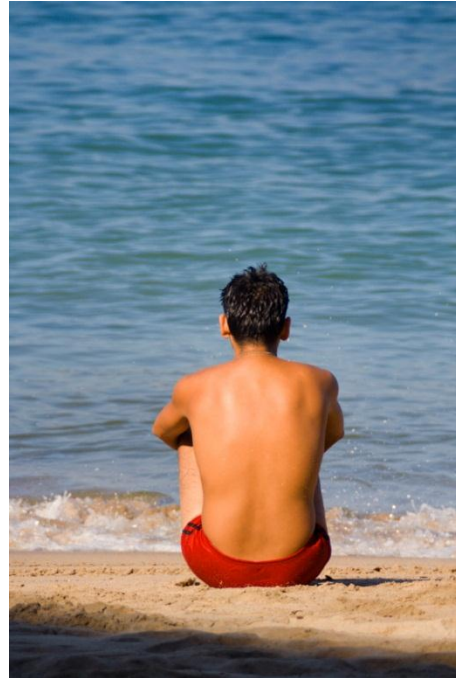

Examination Rules

1. Students may not depart until **10:00 a.m.** (morning exams) and **2:00 p.m.** (afternoon).
2. Students arriving **AFTER** an hour has passed, may not write.
3. Students may not leave the exam room while writing without **supervisor accompaniment.**
4. There may be **no talking**, whispering or exchanging of information.
5. Students **may NOT discuss** the exam with a supervisor unless the booklet is flawed.
6. Students must **remain seated** while writing, and raise their hand if they require special assistance.
7. Students should know that Alberta Education uses computer technology to compare student answer sheets to ensure that students have “not inaccurately represented their performance.”
8. Students who interfere with security by **violating these rules** may
 - a. Be evicted from the exam room.
 - b. Have their diploma invalidated.
 - c. Be barred from writing for one year.
 - d. Have transcripts withheld for one year.
 - e. Have transcripts annotated.
