



CCWA Helen Dueck Memorial Nursing Scholarship for KAHS - \$500

Helen Dueck was a nurse who worked in Coaldale until her retirement. Throughout her career she also served as a health care practitioner in many countries, and continued to work in this capacity as a volunteer after her formal retirement. She displayed strong leadership qualities throughout her life, and served on the Coaldale Hospital Board until the early 90's. The Coaldale Community Wellness Association commemorates Ms. Dueck's contributions to the community of Coaldale and dedicates this scholarship in her memory.

The recipient of this award must show a commitment to voluntary humanitarian and community involvement, with plans to further their education in the field of nursing or health care at a post-secondary institution. Applicants must also demonstrate a good work ethic and strength of character, despite personal, financial, or physical challenges. Academic requirements are English 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30 or Science 30, and Math 30-1 or Math 31.

- **Personal Summary:** highlight your top skills and achievements in one or two sentences.
- **Education:** list the current average or final grades received in English 30-1, Biology 30, Chemistry 30 or Science 30, and Math 30-1 or Math 31.
- **Volunteer Activity:** list the organizations you have volunteered with over the past three years. List your role within the organization. Write a brief statement summarizing the goal of each organization and what you enjoyed or learned from each organization regardless of whether it was a positive or negative experience.
- **Skills:** provide a list of general skills and skills gained by your volunteer experience.

Write a cover letter introducing yourself and highlight your volunteer experience, the goal of each organization and the experience gained by your participation. Provide details of your plan to attend a post-secondary institution in the field of nursing/health care and include support documentation of pre-acceptance into a nursing/health care program, if possible.

Applicants must be a graduating grade 12 student attending KAHS with plans to attend a post-secondary institution in a program related to health care. Preference will be given to those enrolled in a post-secondary nursing program.

Applications will be judged by the CCWA Awards Committee based on academics, plans to enroll in a post-secondary nursing/health care program, volunteer activity, leadership roles, and overall presentation of resumé and cover letter. The successful applicant will be required to submit their SIN for the purpose of issuing a T4A tax form as per CRA regulations.

His dedication and commitment to his fellow citizens is apparent, as he served on the board for close to 40 years. The Coaldale Community Wellness Association commemorates Mr. Janzen's contributions to the community of Coaldale and dedicates this scholarship in his memory.

George Wall farmed irrigated and dry land with his sons on establishments near Coaldale to south of Readymade. He also served as a board member on the Coaldale Hospital Association for most of the 80's and 90's. The Coaldale Community Wellness Association commemorates Mr. Wall's contributions to the community of Coaldale and dedicates this award in his memory.

The recipient of this award must demonstrate a keen interest in agriculture through extracurricular activities, with plans to further their education in the field of Agriculture at a post-secondary institution.
