## Information Verification/FOIPP/ Technology Consent Forms

In September, Grade 10 – 12 students were given a package which included a *WHITE* Information Verification Form, a *GOLD/ORANGE coloured* Information Technology User Agreement/Permission Form and a *BRIGHT YELLOW coloured* Consents for Information Disclosure form. While most of these forms have been returned to the office, there are still some missing. If you still have these forms please complete them (must be completed by a partent/guardian) and return them to the office immediately. If you need new forms, please come to the office to get new ones.

These forms are important and must be completed each year and submitted to the office.

Most Grade 9 students completed these forms when they registered for KAHS, however we are still missing a handful.

The **Information Verification Form** helps us to keep our contact information for student's families up to date, and allows us to be able to complete government forms, such as requests from Canada Revenue Agency, when they ask for confirmation of where a student lived and who they lived with. Without consistent, proper documentation, we are not able to complete such requests.

The **FOIPP** and **Information Technology Consents** are also important so that we know what permissions students have in regards to Media & Information release and computer/internet access on School computers. Computer Access will be revoked for students who have not submitted a completed Information Technology Form, and students who have not submitted the completed Consents for Information Disclosure will not be included in pictures.

Students will not be able to access Palliser technology without handing in the Information and Technology Consents form. They will not have access to Wifi at KAHS until it is submitted.



Multiple parents have indicated that they are having issues with School Messenger (that one or more of their children are not listed). We are working on correcting this issue. For many parents/guardians we are finding that *"Refreshing the Contacts in the School Messenger App"* will add missing students back in.



All BASIC School Fees are <u>due before school begins</u>. Students who have outstanding fees from previous years or who have not paid the Basic School Fees (\$97 for Grade 9 or \$35 for Grade 10-12) WILL NOT receive text books until these fees are paid.

Most Grade 9 students are registered in both Foods & Construction/Fabrication. The fee of \$31 will be removed/refunded for any student who is not taking these courses.

Any families who are experiencing financial difficulties and as such are not able to pay basic school fees before classes begin, are encouraged to speak with Mr. Grimes to discuss payment plans or other options. (daniel.grimes@pallisersd.ab.ca or 403-345-3383)

The Per Course fees (which apply only to Grades 10-12) for the first semester will be invoiced on September 15th, 2021 and then on February 28th, 2022 for the second semester. Students who drop courses after September 30th, 2021 and February 26th, 2022, respectively, will forfeit their fee.

The Per Course Fees pay for costs associated with specific supplies or services used in that particular class. (i.e. – groceries for Foods, wood or metal for Construction/Fabrication, Music for Band, Choir, Guitar, thread/machine maintenance and limited supplies for Fashion Studies or Field Trip & Equipment costs for Phys. Ed.)

Unpaid school fees will be carried over to the next school year. Grade 12 students with outstanding school fees are not permitted to participate in Grad.
