

and the results were very positive. The respondents of the survey would like to meet 2 times a year. Some participants said they'd like to meet in their region groups before joining all 3 sites videoconference.

-Class sites in Palliser are still small overall. Palliser's average class size is below provincial guidelines in grades 4-6, 7-9 and 10-12 where Alberta Education suggests 23, 25 and 27 respectively. In K-3, the province suggests 17 and Palliser averages 18.2. One area of concern is JE where the school is out of space and the school is full despite the addition of 2 modular classrooms. Administration will be looking at all our schools in Coaldale to see how space in other schools can be better used.

-We are seeing strong early reading skills in grade 1. About 62% grade 1 students are reading at or above expectation this fall compared to the previous year.

-In December a family in Palliser was in a fatal car accident where the father and one of the children were killed. A trust fund at ATB Financial has been set up to help the family. Donations can be made at any ATB Financial branch.

-Dave Shaw presented a transportation accountability report to the board at their last board meeting. Think of Us on the Bus campaign continues in its 4<sup>th</sup> year with continued support from law enforcement partners. Palliser purchased 8 additional camera systems. Each of the 8 units has internal and external cameras, complete with microphones. Cameras can he moved if needed. The plan is to outfit 7-10 buses a year.

-LGBTQ: the board met today to discuss the 12 guidelines given from the gov't. After reviewing the document, there was a discussion on how Palliser already has a lot of these policies in place. On our website you can find the AP's (Administrative procedures). Some of those are: #205

Controversial issues, 310 Safe and caring, 317 VTRA, 319 appendix: bullying behavior in schools. We were also informed by Kevin that he had a discussion with Alberta Ed yesterday and the tone he understood was that boards do not have to create a stand-alone policy. If we already have policies that address the 12 guidelines for LGBTQ, the all we need to do is compare our policies and the guidelines and make sure we are covering everything. The board has asked admin to do this and also to speak to our legal counsel, and then at our Feb. 9<sup>th</sup> board meeting, present us with a draft. Also at that meeting we will open the meeting up for parents and anyone who has concerns to comment and give input on the draft. We will also be sending the draft to principals to bring to school councils and it will be posted on our website all looking for feedback.

-Heather Lee asked questions of the trustees to which they did not have the answers on hand. They will e-mail her the answers. Heather was also asked to e-mail such questions to them as Harry and Sharon did not the questions pertained to our school. Heather noted that the board minutes of 2013 of November 2013 are not published.

- 5. International Students:
  - Our seven Brazilian students have left for home. Feedback we have received is that it was a very positive experience for them. We had some send-off activities for them – special lunch, bowling and pizza one evening and generally a lot of well wishes and hugs from friendships they made at KA.
  - We have one student who is from Chile. She will join us for January and February.
  - We have four new Brazilian students joining us for Semester 2.
- 6. Europe Trip was cancelled due to safety and travel advisory concerns due to terrorist attacks in France. A revised trip plan has been approved. The trip will be to the US Eastern Seaboard (March 22 31) Jen Nieboer and Mike Gibson will be chaperones.
- 7. SRO RCMP Doug Sokoloski is our new SRO. Constable Sokoloski has been at the school several times. Transition has been good, has been connecting with the children.

- 8. School Review: We had several central office personnel and district principals visit our school on December 2. Students and staff completed surveys. We reached 50% of parents completing surveys before Christmas. We hope to have a workshop with Cynthia Gietz on our school review document sometime in March after that month's board meeting. Hope to have the workshop before Easter break to present tot school.
- 9. Two new teachers will join us on February 1. Jacob Fraser and a half time for a mat leave till May. When we reported our number of students in September we estimated 314 we actually ended up with 354.
- 10. It is Accountability Pillar survey time again. Grade 10 students and all teachers will complete surveys at school. Parents of grade 10 students will have surveys mailed to their homes. We have 85 grade 10's attending the school.
- 11. Students have requested the formation of a GSA club. A teacher has agreed to be the sponsor and we are working to develop guidelines for this.

## 12. Sports program:

- We are mid-way through our basket-ball season. It is possible that both our senior boys and girls teams will qualify for provincials.
- Grade 9 boys had their home tournament this past weekend.
- 13. We are in the process of developing a revised course selection process for students. The purpose is to make it an easier to follow process for students and parents. Palliser will be moving to a new online program

	for reporting purposes – to Power School from SIRS. Implementation will be from May 1 to June 15. There will be a "learning curve" so I will have to see how this affects scheduling.	
	14. Power School will make access to IPPs in the Dossier program more efficient for access and use.
