Appendix B:

Principal's Report for Kate Andrews School Council – March 17/16

- January diploma exams results have been available for about a week. We have had an opportunity to analyze the results. Generally our students did about the same as the province. I have submitted a summary for central office. PAT (gr. 9) results in Science and Social Studies were quite positive overall.
- Fountas and Pinnell testing complete. This is a reading assessment for those students who were reading below grade level according to this testing tool. Forty three students were tested and all except a few made significant improvements in their comprehension. OCA testing (gr. 9 and 10) was completed and marked. Our students are demonstrating improved writing skills competencies from a year ago.
- 3. I have submitted an itemized list of resources/equipment to central office requesting approval to spend some of our Board allocated funds surplus. I received confirmation today that it has been approved.
- 4. The US Eastern Seaboard trip (March 22 31) is all set to go. Chaperones will be Nicole Hanna and Mike Gibson.
- 5. Our new teachers that joined us on Feb 1 are establishing themselves in their courses Grace Martin (English 10-1 and 10-2) and Jacob Fraser (French 10-30, Math 10-3, CALM 20 and Math 9 KE).
- 6. Grad 2016 Plans are moving forward and progressing well. Information on our website should be updated after Easter Break.
- 7. We are still waiting for our school review workshop. We hope to have that take place in late April or early May.
- 8. Course selections for next year have begun. There are two steps to this program. The initial step will be completed next week. Step two will involve meeting with students individually to work through an academic planner which we have developed. This will be done after Easter break. I hope to have a tentative master schedule completed before the end of April.

- 9. Sports News:
 - a. Both senior girls' and boys' basketball teams have qualified for provincials. Provincials are occurring this week. JV teams as well as the grade 9 boys' team concluded their seasons.
 - b. Spring Sports: Tryouts have begun.
- 10. Our four Brazilian students seem to be doing fine and fitting in well.
- 11. The Palliser Student Leadership Symposium is scheduled for April 22 in Calgary. We are planning presentations for that event. We hope to have a contingent of about 20-30 students attend.
- 12. Parent/teacher interviews were scheduled for the following times: Monday, March 14 (4:00 – 5:00 and 6:00 9:00 PM) Tuesday, March 15 (4:00 – 6:00 PM) The turnout was similar to meetings held in Fall.
- 13. SRO RCMP Doug Sokoloski is our SRO. I now have his direct phone number so if he is needed on short notice that should be workable.
